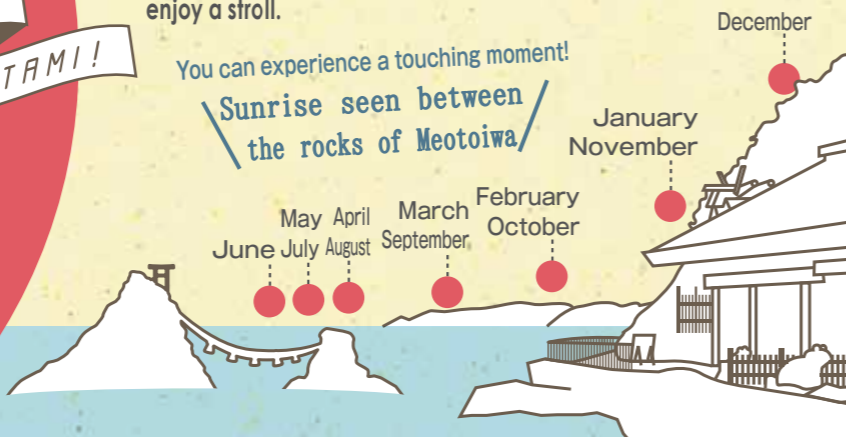

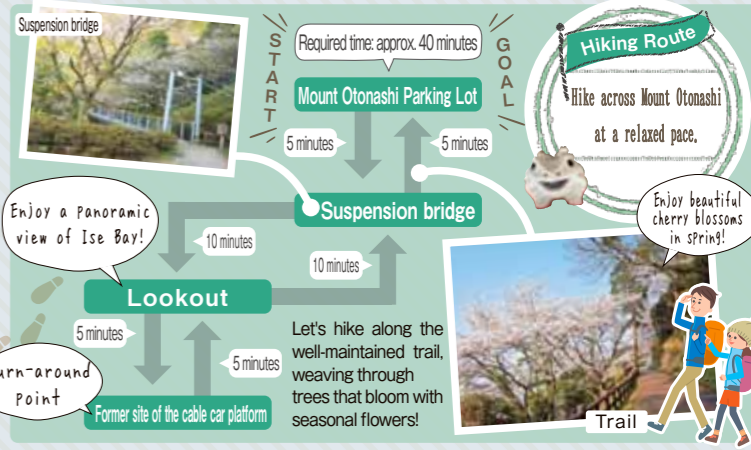

1 Mishiodono Shrine

At the end of the approach to this Shinto shrine, you will see its main sanctuary on the left and a salt-production facility called "Mishiodono" on the right. Additionally, there are also several other salt-production facilities, such as "Mishioyashiro" and "Mishioyuresho" at the rear of those buildings. Those facilities have been utilized to manufacture *kojicho*, unrefined solid salt used at Ise Jingu, in a traditional way for over two thousand years.



Futamiura Swimming Beach

Futamiura was one of Japan's first nationally designated bathing beaches. Back in those days, sea bathing was for medical purposes. After the war, it reopened as a comfortable swimming beach with white sand (now located at its current site), and has thrived annually with numerous tourists.



2 Hinjitsukan

Hinjitsukan was built in 1887 as an accommodation facility for pilgrims to Ise Jingu and visited by many guests, including members of the Japanese Imperial Family and important figures from various fields. Today, it serves as a museum open to the public.

At this information center, you can ask anything about trips around Futami!

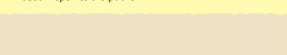

3 Meotoiwa and Futami Okitama Shrine

Meotoiwa (literally, "Wedded Rocks") are a symbol of Futami. Futami Okitama Shrine worships the sacred stone called "Okitama Shrine", which is located 700 meters offshore in the sea and believed to have some connection with the mythological deity named "Sarutahiko". The shrine is also known for its blessings related to matchmaking and marital harmony.



4 Ise Sea Paradise

Ise Sea Paradise is an aquarium where you can interact with marine creatures. At the entrance, Stellar sea lions welcome you. While at the aquarium, you can enjoy shaking hands withotters and meeting adorable sea lions and earless seals as well as majestic walrus.

Mishiohama

Mishiohama and Mishiodono

Mishiohama is a salt farm where high-concentration salty water is collected to produce salt dedicated to Ise Jingu to be used for exorcism and purification. The collected salty water turns into coarse salt at the facility called "Mishioyakisho," and then is roasted and solidified at another facility called "Mishiodono" before it is dedicated to Ise Jingu as *katashio* (unrefined solid salt).

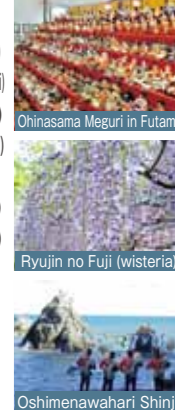


Taikoji Temple

Taikoji Temple is a venerable Buddhist temple that enshrines not only Buddhist but also Shinto deities: it actually has a Shinto shrine called "Moto Okitamasha" on its premises. This temple is said to have been built by Gyoki, a famous Buddhist monk, about 1,300 years ago. Its principal object of worship is the statue of Senju Kannon Bosatsu (Thousand-armed Avalokiteshvara) designated as a nationally important cultural property, which is renowned for its blessings related to longevity and healing. The temple is also well-known as a "temple of flowers" where visitors can enjoy wisteria and hydrangeas and as a "temple of pets."

Seasonal Events Held in Futamiura

- Yutate Shinji January 14 (Eino Shrine)
- Kannon Himatsuri February through early March (Sunday just before January 18 according to the old lunar calendar (Taikoji Temple))
- Ohinasama Meguri in Futami Early February through early March (area along Meotoiwa Omotesando Street and some other parts of Futami)
- Ryujin no Fuji (wisteria) Best season: late April through early May (Taikoji Temple)
- Oshimenawahari Shinji May 5, September 5 and mid-December (Meotoiwa and Futami Okitama Shrine)
- Mokari Shinji May 21 (Futami Okitama Shrine)
- Geshisai Day of the summer solstice (Futami Okitama Shrine)
- Swimming at Futamiura Beach Early July through late August (Futamiura Swimming Beach)
- Futami Taisai Shimenawahiki July 14 (JR Futaminoura Station to Futami Okitama Shrine via Meotoiwa Omotesando Street)
- Futami Okitama Shrine Reitaisai July 15 (Futami Okitama Shrine) *Yoimiyasai is held on July 14.
- Takamatsu Inari Taisai Early August (Takamatsu Inari Shrine)
- Mishiodonosai October 5 (Mishiodono Shrine)
- Moonrise from Meotoiwa (full moon) Autumn through winter (Meotoiwa) *10 days or so in total around the time of full moon

Kugurishima

Kugurishima is a sea cave located at the end of Kozaki Beach known as a rocky shore. It was formed through intense erosion by seawater and waves. People in Futami worship the sea cave, and annually in July, they replace the *shimenawa* (sacred ropes), which is hung at its entrance, with the new ones they made by themselves. At that time, they pray for the safety of their own families.

Accessible only at low tide during a spring tide!

Makonde Art Museum

Makonde Art Museum is a museum that houses a collection of sculptures created by the Makonde people, who lived on the Makonde Plateau in Tanzania. The museum exhibits over 500 items of folk materials, including paintings, musical instruments and daily tools, which help visitors feel even closer to African culture. While in the museum, you might hear the sound of hot wind and the cries of life from East Africa.

How about relaxing in the bath to relieve your fatigue from traveling?

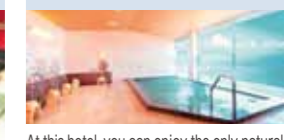
